Our water system violated drinking water standards over the past year. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

What happened?

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During **September 2025**, we did not monitor or test adequately for Disinfection Byproducts – Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs) at the approved sampling sites, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.
